This year February moves us quickly into Lent. Ash Wednesday comes early, on February 10. Session decided that this is a year to simplify a little and that we will not have an Ash Wednesday service. So I encourage you to visit a church that does have a service on February 10. Most churches will note an extra service on their web site, so you should be able to find a location fairly easily.

The church has Lenten devotional booklets available that are published by Presbyterians Today. The group that has been meeting after worship for conversation, will be using this booklet as a focus for their discussion during Lent. Feel free to join in, even if you haven't been part of this conversation to date. The group meets for about half an hour after worship and is guided by the thoughts and stirrings of those present.

The session is moving ahead in their search for a Stated Supply Pastor and will keep you informed as to their progress. This is a clear sign that there will be pastoral change in the fairly near future. That is always a time of excitement and eagerness as well as a time of some anxiety of the uncertainty and the unknown. All who spoke gave thanks to the congregation for its support monetarily, as in supporting the youth mission trip, the Estacada Area Food Bank and Christmas adopt-a-family, as well as for their devotion of time and talent at a B & G clean-up day, for shopping in support of the food bank, homeless mission and Christmas families and for designing and planning our new sanctuary window. Special thanks were given to Gilbert Shibley for "all things Springwater", Barbara Shibley for her work at the food bank, and Lynda Conway for her financial prowess keeping the books.

The Endowment Committee approved expenditures last year for the youth mission trip, \$6000 was used. The endowment fund received some gifts in 2015 and expects to have funds to disburse in 2016. The committee is looking at projects to support.

Debbie Ingamells, chair of the worship committee, thanks all ushers and worship leaders for their service in 2015. She notes that one more pair of ushers is needed for 2016. Please contact her if you are interested.

The Deacons would like to thank Peter Sturman for his services as a Deacon during his time at SPC and wish the Sturmans well in their new adventures. SPC now has six deacons, welcoming Kathy Scott, Mary Johnson and Cindy Woodbury. They continue to provide for the individual and collective needs of our congregation through quarterly meals together and prayer chain phone lists, website, and other hospitality.

The nominating committee recommended, and the congregation voted to approve Tom Watson and Debbie Ingamells as ruling elders for a three year term. Nike Guttridge and Cindy Woodbury as Deacons for a three year term.

The stated supply is provided as a one year, renewable contract. This gives us the freedom to take some time as a congregation and, if we choose, to engage in a mission study to better understand our future.


Pastor Beverly Crow invited those present at the congregational meeting to consider our last year as a book: what would the chapters be? Some thoughts from the audience:
