#### **Buildings & Grounds**

In December a renewal of the rental agreement for the manse was signed by the Yorks and our Clerk of Session. This keeps most of the terms of the former month-month rental agreement that had been set up by our contracted property manager. Now that Patti Turner has retired from that business, the church, as owner, has direct dealings with tenants. Starting in January 2016 the rent is \$100 higher. The market has changed and so has an old building's maintenance expense.



For over 50 years the manse was where the pastor and family was housed. For most of the last 30 it has been rented instead. For most of its life there had been two native Bigleaf Maples, one in front and one behind. Five years ago the one in back was taken down because it got too big, old and rotten. Now it is time to assess the strength and future of the one in front. It is natural for strong winds to bring down limbs. A strong gust last week broke off part of the cedar between the church and manse. Your B & G Committee will take a hard look in January, with professional advice, at the hazard potential and remedies for all the trees within reach of buildings. Before buds open to new leaves, action may be needed.

We as a congregation are turning over a new leaf on the calendar and soon, in our pastoral leadership. Just as buildings and grounds need changing care as they grow older, so do our individual bodies and our life together as the body of Christ. As I get old I am delighted to see our youngest member grow into a new role as bell ringer. When I now pass the Peace of Christ to Cortlan I am also shaking the hand of one serving us as a willing part of our team, announcing to the broader community that we are here helping each other grow, celebrating our life in Christ and welcoming all.
