Pastor's Perspective

Stewardship... how we use time and talents for our own wellbeing and personal growth as well as the well-being of the whole human community.

November is just around the corner, and with that, the usual pledging cycle called Stewardship. We would like you to know that there will be some minor changes in our "stewardship campaign" this year. Yes, there will be a time in which we will ask you for a pledge to the 2015 budget, but that might be stressed a bit less this year than it has been in the past. You see, the Session has agreed to make a little bit different stewardship "pitch" throughout the year rather than mostly in the fall months. We think that the way many churches have done stewardship tends to equate stewardship with raising funds for next year. That's part of stewardship, but a more fullorbed concept of stewardship also takes into account how we use our many talents and our time; not just what we use in "church activities," but also how we use time and talents for our own well-being and personal growth as well as the well-being of the whole human community. Stewardship also includes how we care for the planet earth and our environment, God's marvelous creation and gift to us for all of the ages. It may even include how we respond to God's children, and especially how we respect and value those who are different from us and whose culture is different from ours. That all means that over the next year, the Session will choose one dimension of stewardship to emphasize each month – perhaps in the newsletter, in the bulletin, in a "Minute for Mission" during Sunday worship, in a sermon, or in a special program – to lift up for your thinking, your prayers, your new commitments.

Again, we don't want to disregard the need to talk about the church budget and the needs of the church for program and mission activities, but at the same time that we think about those important aspects of church life, we want to encourage the whole church to think about what it means to consider stewardship in a much deeper and fuller way. Keep your eyes and your ears and your mind open to see if being a steward takes on new meaning for you over the next year or so.

On a completely different note: with Beverly returning from the sabbatical travels with Eileen on September 30, you will be hearing and seeing much more of her during October. Thank you much for your patience with her absence and with my being the only "pastoral presence" this past month.
